Principal's Report

For the first time our house athletics carnival was held off site at the Edwin Flack Athletics Track in Berwick. The students participated in a variety of track and field events throughout the day and enjoyed the opportunity to utilise these facilities. The House results for the athletics carnival are:

The athletics carnival also provides the opportunity for our students to qualify to compete at the District Athletics Carnival being held later in term 3. Thank you to Mrs Drew and Mr Seton for the organisation and preparation that enabled the carnival to proceed very smoothly. I would also like to extend my thanks to the many parents who attended the athletics day and provided support and encouragement to our competitors from the outskirts of the reserve.

Tomorrow we have 50 students representing PLPS at the District Cross Country carnival at Toomuc Reserve. We wish them the best of luck in their 2km or 3km runs.

Last Friday students in all year levels would have received their Term 2 Area newsletter. This document has been produced to share information with families regarding the teaching and learning that will take place at each year level this term. It will also outline special events that the students will experience or have the opportunity to participate in during second term, including excursions and incursions.

On Tuesday our Year Prep, 1 and 5 students and staff were treated to a wonderful musical performance from our students at PLPS. Our Prep and Year 1 students put on a great performance of "True Colours" at the Cardinia Cultural Centre. The efforts of our children reflected the time and commitment put into concert preparations by our Performing Arts teachers, Ms Dahmen and Mrs Reddan. Thank you also to the children's home group teachers for the support and assistance they have provided to our students. On behalf of our staff, I would also like to extend my thanks and appreciation to our parents and families for their understanding and support of the children and our Performing Arts program through the provision of costumes. The students thoroughly enjoyed the experience of performing for their peers on stage in a theatre setting. Although our families were unable to attend the live performance, I'm sure the performance will be enjoyed immensely when the recording becomes available. Please note orders and payments need to be finalised by Wednesday, June 2nd. Congratulations to all involved for another wonderful musical performance by our children.

One of our key priorities at PLPS is to ensure all staff remain aware of and informed about information and research around teaching practices and approaches that impact positively upon our students' learning. One of the key sets of data which enables us to evaluate how effectively we are achieving this goal is student feedback. One of the major tools we use to gather this important data is the Student Attitudes to School survey which is completed annually by our students in years 4 – 6.

This survey is conducted online and will provide our school leadership team with important information that will be considered when we are

making future decisions around staffing, professional learning and development, resourcing of future programs and curriculum development. The survey's framework is developed around the following key domains:

- effective and engaging teaching practices
- teacher/student relationships
- student learner characteristics
- social engagement
- student safety
- student health and wellbeing.

The period in which our students can complete the survey begins today and closes on Friday, May 28th. Important information about the survey, including the option to withdraw your child from the survey, was distributed to parents of students in years 4, 5 and 6 on April 28th. Once our student responses are completed and aggregated, we will be able to access our school's report to inform our discussions. I look forward to sharing the findings from the survey with our school community.

Next week our students in years 3 and 5 will sit the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). Our students will participate in tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy on the following dates:

- Tuesday, May 11th - Language conventions and writing
- Wednesday, May 12th - Reading
- Thursday, May 13th - Numeracy

The tests in these various disciplines provides parents with an understanding of how individual students are performing in these areas at the time of testing. Pamphlets detailing further information for parents were distributed to our year 3 and year 5 students on Monday.

NAPLAN testing is just one aspect of our school's assessment and reporting program and this NAPLAN data complements assessment that is conducted on an ongoing basis by our teaching staff in the learning spaces. Individual student reports will be returned to the school later in 2021 which are then distributed to parents and students.

Tomorrow we farewell Ms Jeric for a period of time, as she commences her maternity leave. Last Friday Ms Gillam also began her maternity leave. We wish both of them all the best as they begin their families.

Yesterday we held our Mother's Day stall that allowed students to purchase gifts for mums or other significant female figures in their lives. A special thank you to the members of our Parents and Friends group for their preparation and organisation of the stall, together with our education support staff who assisted with the stall throughout the day. Your support is greatly appreciated.

I would like to wish all our Mums a very happy Mothers' Day for this coming Sunday.

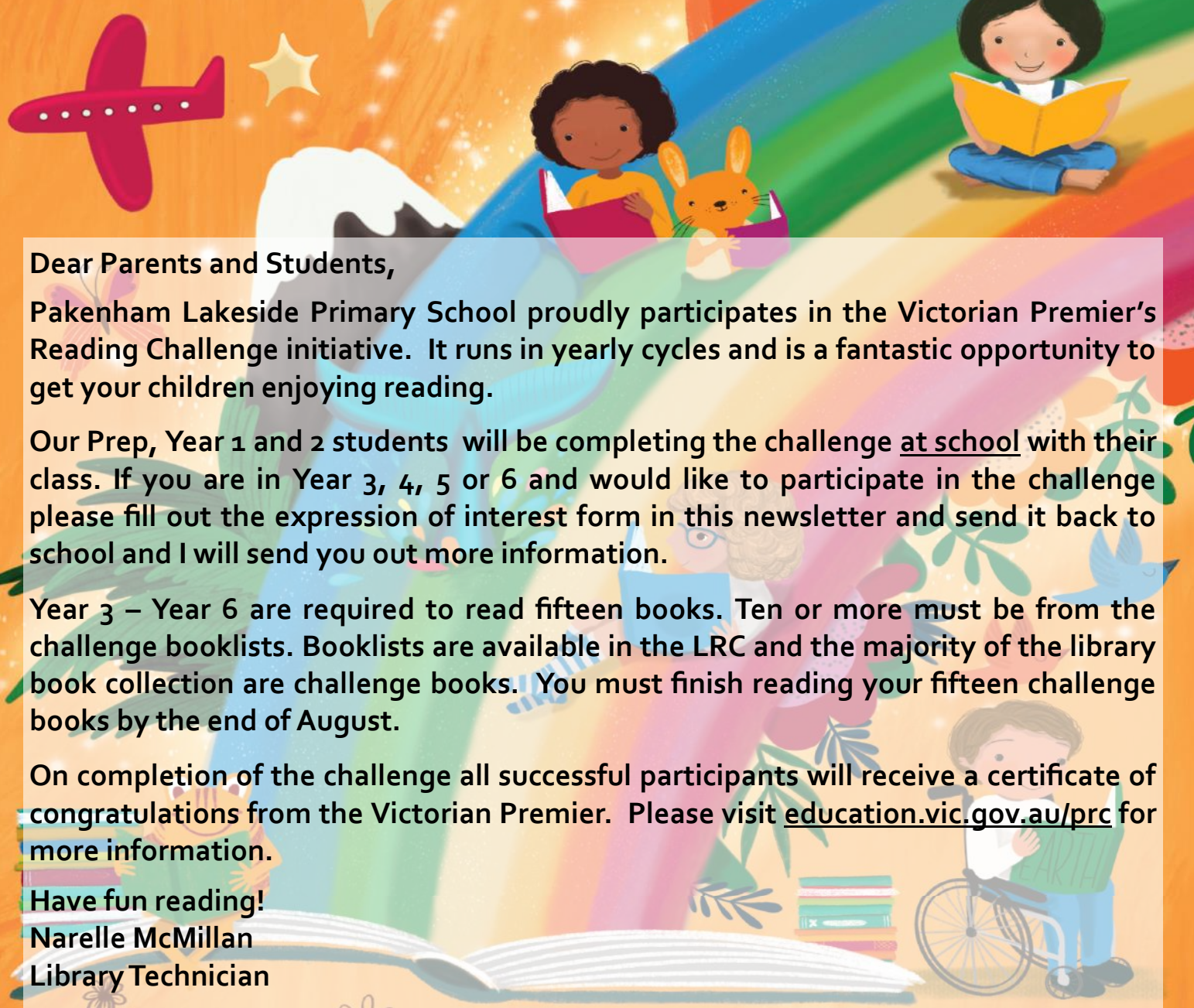
True Colours Junior Concert 2021

Word of the week

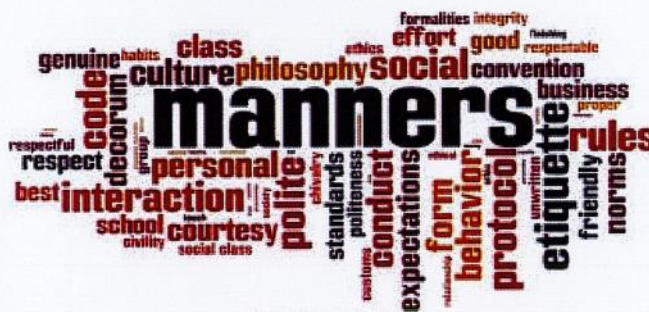

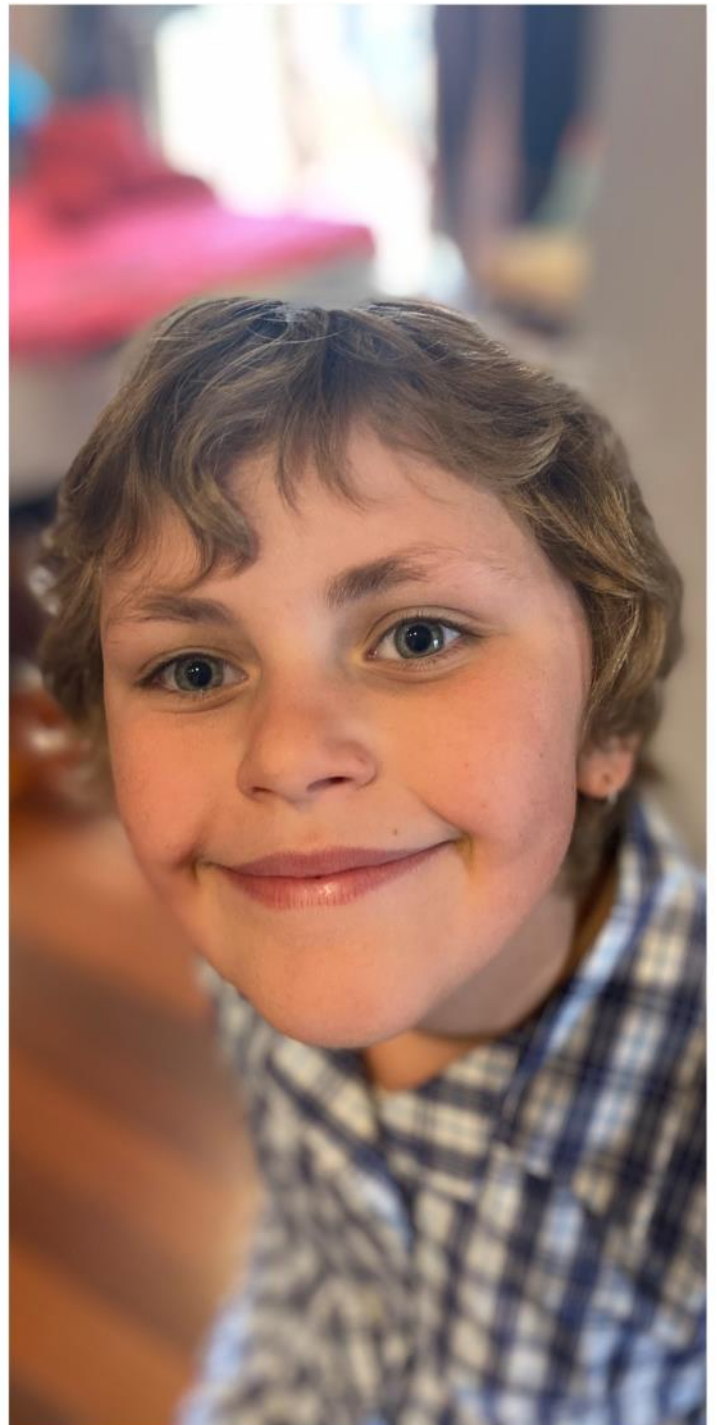
