#### Principal's Report

It is exciting to once again have our students participating in a variety of events and activities.

Information will be coming home soon for our Junior School concert. The concert will involve each of the classes in years prep and one performing an item. The dates for the performances are Tuesday, May 10<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday, May 11<sup>th</sup>.

Information will also be coming home shortly for our year 6 camp. Our year 6 students will be travelling to Canberra from October 3<sup>rd</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup>. This camp provides our students with an outstanding opportunity to experience learning directly associated with their inquiry unit of work, in civics and citizenship. As part of the camp program, students will visit a number of buildings, sites and attractions associated with the development and role of government in Australia.

Last Monday evening our School Council conducted its first meeting for 2022. A number of items of business were discussed at the meeting. Foremost amongst the items was a report on our 2022 Annual Implementation Plan (AIP). This document outlines our key implementation strategies that we will be focusing on during this year and reflects the longer term strategic priorities contained in our current School Strategic Plan and the current Department of Education priorities. The strategies are based around two core areas of our school's operations:

- 1. student learning
- 2. student wellbeing

The key implementation strategies we will be embedding are; the planning and assessment practices in numeracy, teacher practices in reading and building student capacity to monitor their own learning. As well as specifying these areas targeted for development, our plan outlines how we will allocate resources to enable our work to be undertaken effectively and how we will monitor progress and any targets or milestones which will provide a gauge to evaluate our degrees of achievement. I look forward to sharing further information with our school community regarding our AIP as the year unfolds.

As part of our selection process, students were requested to write their thoughts and ideas about leadership at PLPS. As Principal, I was very proud, not only of the number of applications I received from our children, but also with the outstanding quality of many of the applications I received. Students took the opportunity to share with me why they would make suitable student leaders and how they would "live our values." They also shared with me the types of behaviours and attitudes that they believed our student leaders should exhibit. As with any election process, there will also be some applicants who are not successful with their applications. However, all senior students have a key role to play in setting the tone and providing role models to our younger students.

The safety of our students is important to us all. When students are riding their bikes and scooters to school, it is important for them to take care of themselves and others, particularly when crossing roads and when in close proximity to the gates. When inside the school grounds, students need to walk their bikes and scooters to where they are going. When outside the gates, students are required to walk their bikes when they are close to the gates in the morning or until they are safely past all school gates in the afternoons. 








- You're wearing a helmet and enclosed shoes
- Your bike has been checked and is ready to go.



#### When riding

- · Use the foot-path as much as possible and be respectful of others using it
- bell to let people know you are coming.

#### When you are ready to cross the road:


- STOP, LOOK, LISTEN, THINK to check that it is safe to cross
- Always choose traffic lights, a pedestrian crossing or a school crossing where possible

- Working brakes
- Pumped up tyres
- Lights that are working
- A bell that rings
