Principal's Report

A key component of our school's culture is our desire to continuously seek ways to improve important aspects around our school's performance. We are currently conducting our annual Parent Opinion survey to gather information from our parent community and their thoughts about PLPS. The Parent Opinion survey is offered by the Department of Education and Training and is completed by a randomly selected sample of our parent community. It is designed to assist our school in gaining an understanding of our parents' perception of our school climate and environment, our core purpose of learning and teaching, student wellbeing and important relationships. These survey results will help to inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies. On Tuesday this week, emails were sent to a number of our families requesting their participation in our annual Parent Opinion Survey. The survey is conducted online and will take approximately 20 minutes to complete. If you have received an email inviting you to participate, it would be much appreciated if you could complete the survey. Thanking you in anticipation for your time to provide your thoughts, ideas and valued information. The survey will be open until Friday, September 16th.

A reminder that next week is Book Week. "Dreaming with eyes open...." is the theme for 2022. One of the activities taking place at PLPS in celebration of this week, is the Book Character dress up day. This fun filled day is coming up next Tuesday, August 22nd. As part of our Book Week celebrations our Prep students will be attending a performance by Carp Productions. The performance incorporates the Book Week theme of "Dreaming with eyes open.." Audience participation allows for students to be involved in the story telling. The performance supports and enhances the Preps current reading program where the students are learning to identify main characters and events from a text. The performance also aims to highlight the benefits of reading and the power of imagination.

On Monday our girls Tee ball team competed at the Division Winter Sport competition. They had an enjoyable day and finished the day with a solid win. The boys Tee ball competition was postponed and will now be competing next Tuesday in Cheltenham. Our boys soccer team will also be competing on Tuesday at Casey Fields. these events.

Next Wednesday our year 3 students will be leaving for their first school camp to Phillip Island Adventure Camp. The students and staff are looking forward to the opportunity of visiting various sites on Phillip Island and challenging themselves on the variety of activities being offered throughout the camp. Our students will participate in a number of activities that promote resilience and present the students with personal challenges. It provides an environment where the children need to contribute as team members. The camp also provides an excellent opportunity for our students to demonstrate and enact our school's core values out in the wider community. The students will participate in a range of activities including: the giant swing, flying fox, archery, and low ropes and initiative courses.

On Friday, September 2nd, we will have approximately 70 students from years 3-6 representing PLPS at our District athletics carnival being conducted at Casey Fields in Cranbourne. We wish all the students competing the best of luck in each of their events. We hope from this event we will have a number of individuals, and possibly teams continue on to the Division carnival which is scheduled for later this term. We encourage parents to come along to support and cheer on our team. Thank you to Mr Seton and Mr Vann for all of their organisation, planning and preparation to support our athletes on this day.






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Our Prep and Year 1 students have been learning about algorithms and how to program BeeBots and use BeeBot software.




Public libraries have changed a lot in recent years so we want you to know that when accessing li-brary services and equipment
