### **Principal's Report**

Last week our year 3 students returned from their first camp at Phillip Island Adventure Resort. Despite the inclement weather the students continued on with all their activities and enjoyed participating in many new experiences. Thank you to all our staff who attended the camp for their commitment to our children and the camping program at PLPS.

Our year 2 students enjoyed inviting family and friends into the learning spaces for the 'Australian Animal Expo' last Thursday afternoon. The expo allowed the students to share the learning that has taken place throughout the term, primarily within their science and writing units. Thank you to the many family members who came along to share in the students' success.

To commence term 4, many of our year six students will be setting their alarms for an early start, as they arrive at school on Monday at 6:10am to prepare for their departure to Canberra for their camp.

During the camp, students will have the opportunity to visit many buildings and attractions which are of national significance including Parliament House and the Australian War Museum. Our students will also be able to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on our nation's history, culture and the workings of a democracy. These experiences and learning will support the work students will be doing in their Unit of Inquiry on democracy and government.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the camp, the Australian government is contributing funding of \$45 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education rebate program. This rebate will be paid to our school upon completion of their visit. I look forward to conversations with our senior students about their experiences when they return.

All schools have recently been reminded by the Department of Education and Training of the importance of ensuring all students are complying with the mobile phone policy as outlined by DET.

The policy is designed to support teaching and learning, promoting learning environments that are free from unnecessary distractions. The policy also aims to increase physical activity and socialisation at recess and lunch times. A recent review by DET of the policy has found that it has reduced the use of mobile phones during school hours, with a range of benefits noted by principals and teachers.

Our school has its own, local mobile phone policy, which implements the government's mobile policy in line with our local

context. A copy of our policy is available at: <u>Student Mobile</u> <u>Phone Use Policy</u>. Our policy outlines the school's expectations of staff, parents/carers, and students regarding the use of mobile phones by students at school.

With the return to onsite learning for all students in 2022, it is important for the school community to focus its collective efforts on effective implementation of our local mobile phone policy. As such, I encourage families to review our policy and discuss it with your child/ren.

The Department of Education and Training has also published a parent/carer support page on mobile phones in schools on its <u>website</u>. This website includes links to supports for parents/carers on safe and responsible technology use at home.

Final preparations are in full swing for our senior school musical of Shrek Junior. Currently our year 5 and 6 students are working extremely hard at rehearsals in preparation for their performances Tuesday and Wednesday, September 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> at the Cardinia Cultural Centre. Our Performing Arts team of Ms Dahmen and Ms Reddan are supporting our students in their various endeavours, along with other senior level staff members. There are still some tickets available for both evenings and may be purchased by members of our school community at our general office.

Thank you once again to the families who have already completed the parent opinion survey. If you received the link for the survey, it would be much appreciated if you complete the survey as this provides the school with informative data. The link is accessible until Friday, 16<sup>th</sup> September.

A reminder we have a curriculum day on Thursday, September 8th. Students do not attend school on this day. Our OSHClub will be operating a full day's program to support our parents and families on this day. If you require this service you are encouraged to contact OSHClub on 0438 559 017 to book your child's place.

With term three school holidays approaching, I would like to advise all families that OSHClub is again providing a vacation care program for our students at PLPS. Please note that only students who are enrolled at our school will be eligible to participate in the vacation care program.




