Principal's Report

It has been a very busy couple of weeks at PLPS with a variety of camps, incursions and excursions involving many year levels across the school.

Last week our year four students had their three day camp to Woorabinda. Although the weather was quite wet, particularly on the first day, our students involved themselves in all the activities offered at Woorabinda Camp. It was great to see many students attempt some of the challenging and new activities such as the high ropes course, with many overcoming their nerves and completing the course.

Today, our year five students and staff returned from another very successful camp at Beechworth. Although weary from their activities, the four-day camp once again provided some wonderful experiences for our children in one of Victoria's most beautiful and authentic historical towns. I had the opportunity to join our students and staff in Beechworth on Tuesday and Wednesday. I thoroughly enjoyed the many stories the students shared with me as well as participating in some of the experiences with them. It was wonderful to hear the positive feedback I received from the tour guides and our staff about the manner in which our students engaged in the experiences, the prior knowledge they shared, together with the respectful and courteous way they conducted themselves whilst interacting with the public.

Well done to everyone involved with both of our recent camps. On behalf of our students and parents, I would like to extend my appreciation to our staff for their commitment and support of your children as they assisted the students to ensure they had an enjoyable time, whilst participating in the various activities on our camps.

Last Wednesday, our prep students participated in their first excursion and enjoyed a fun filled day at Chesterfield Farm. The farm visit supported their current learning of living and non-living things as they investigate animal features and their body coverings. Highlights from the day included; a cow milking demonstration, a tractor ride and hand feeding the large animals.

Yesterday our year two students went exploring in Pakenham to investigate the indigenous history of the area and the changes that have occurred as the suburb of Pakenham has grown developed over time. There were many things the students enjoyed. When at the library, the students were enthralled with the photos of the main street and the differences between now and then.

Today our year six students participated in the "Just Like Me" Water and Sanitation incursion to support their current unit of inquiry. The program looks at water and sanitation in Australia

and around the world. It involves the students participating in activities to better understand how clean and safe water can affect health and education. The workshop provided an opportunity for the students to view this issue through the lens of a child living in poverty or in a developing country, and how the lack of basic rights impacts children now and into the future.

Last week a poster advertising the events and times for the PLPS ART show was distributed on Compass. We are looking forward to showcasing and celebrating our students art work on opening night Tuesday, November 22nd at the Cardinia Cultural Centre. The show will open at 3.30pm and will conclude at 7.00pm. Please refer to the poster for specific event times.

On Friday, October 28th, all families with students currently in Prep to year five received information via Compass for book packs and parent payments for 2023. As indicated in this information, our **book packs will need to be ordered online.** If parents are wanting to order the student book packs through our preferred supplier Maxim, **orders need to be placed and paid for by Wednesday, January 11th, 2023.** A notable change for 2023, is there will be no book collection day. All the book packs ordered will be delivered to the students learning spaces ready for them to use on their first day of the school year.

With term 4, the planning and preparations for the 2023 school year are well under way. We have commenced the development of our staffing plan for next year. The key driver of this plan is having an accurate figure regarding our student enrolments for next year. Currently we have 105 Prep students enrolled to commence their formal education next year at PLPS. Enrolments have also been received for students in other year levels across the school.

Thank you to those parents who have taken the opportunity to inform the school that their children will not be attending PLPS next year. If you are aware that your child will not be attending our school next year, could you please contact our school office on 5940-9532 to let us know. Your assistance with this is very much appreciated and allows us to accurately plan for 2023.


