### Principal's Report

Congratulations to all of our students, Ms Lowndes and Ms Bennett for our wonderful Art Show on Tuesday evening. There were many families and friends at the Cardinia Cultural Centre to view and celebrate the artwork the students have completed throughout the school year.

This wonderful exhibition was brought together through the many hours of preparation and organisation carried out by Ms Lowndes, Ms Bennett and many others who committed their time and energy to prepare and set up the exhibition for the evening. Thank you also to the members of staff who worked with our Visual Arts teachers to ensure a successful evening.

On Monday our All Star girls basketball Hooptime team competed in the State Hooptime competition at Dandenong Basketball stadium. The team comprised of Hannah, Abby, Peyton, Harper, Jasmine, Kythea and Lillie from year 4. The team had an outstanding day, winning four of their six games, thus being one of the top eight teams in the state. This is a best result ever for an All Star team from PLPS. Thanks to the many parents who assisted with transport and who came along to support the team throughout the day, the girls really appreciated everyone being there. Thank you to Mr Seton for the preparation and coaching of the team. Congratulations to everyone involved.

Last week our School Council convened for the November meeting and considered a number of important items on our agenda, including the school summary report of our 2022 NAPLAN reports. The five areas being assessed are Reading, Writing, Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation and Number. Within these areas, the measures recorded in the reports are the school mean, percentage of students in the top two bands and the percentage of students in the bottom two bands. Over all the results demonstrate an improvement in the majority of these areas. The other measure in our reports is the percentage of students in the top two bands in comparison to similar schools and our network. The percentage for our students in the top two bands is higher than the network average percentage in all areas in year 5 and year 3 except for one area being 1% from the average. Our students, staff and families can be extremely proud of the

learning that has been achieved.

Information for some of our school camps scheduled for 2023 will be shared with families in the near future for students moving into year 5, and early next year for students moving into year 6. The cost of camps will need to be increased for 2023 due to a number of factors. These include a general increase in the amount camps are charging to attend, the increase in transport and fuel costs and the recent changes to the industrial agreement for school staff to include payments to staff who attend school camps. To ensure we can continue our camp program, we are endeavoring to keep camp cost to a minimum.

The terms of the new industrial agreement has also had an impact on the number of school events we are able to host outside of school hours. To enable us to continue to stage events our students and families have enjoyed, a change of time or format has been required.

You may recall, in May this year we received notification that our school had been allocated substantial funding to install much needed drainage at the eastern end of our school grounds. I am pleased to inform our community we have recently had a meeting to begin this project. The project will be managed by the Department of Education's Victorian Schools Building Authority. Last week we met with representatives from VSBA, the architects and engineers to begin the planning of the work required. With many steps to be completed, we are hopeful of works beginning mid 2023.

An additional drainage project has also been funded by DET, in order to increase the pipe capacity to facilitate the exit of water into the storm water drains. This work has been scheduled to begin once the students have finished, due to its proximity to classrooms.

Yesterday, we concluded the formal transition program that supports our new prep students prepare for the start of their formal schooling. At the conclusion of the sessions, the students collected a bag containing a picture story book and other helpful items they can use at home. However, there are also strategies and activities being organised to assist our current students with being prepared for their 2023 year level. A timetable has been constructed where each year level is able to move to next year's learning spaces and work with different teachers. Our teaching staff will also take the time to hold conversations with the students outlining some of the expectations and differences the children may experience as they advance through primary school into their next year level. These sessions will begin next Friday

Our last curriculum day for 2022 will be Friday, December 9<sup>th</sup>. On this day the staff will be collating and analysing all our student data in preparation for developing goals, actions and strategies in readiness for 2023 classes. Students do not attend school on this day. Our OSHClub will be operating a full day's program to support our parents and families on this day. 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Hats are part of our school uniform in Term 4.


It is strongly recommended that all students have their hats on when they play at recess and lunch time out in the yard.


# ICE CREAM AND LOLLY SHOP
