Principal's Report

I would like to welcome everyone to our 2023 school year. We are looking forward to what promises to be an exciting and enjoyable year of learning as we continue to see our children grow and develop as contributors to our school community at PLPS.

I would like to extend a special welcome to our new students and their families who have joined our PLPS school community. We have 107 Prep students who commenced school last Thursday and it is a great credit to Ms Ashley Clarkson, our Prep staff and the children as to how well they have settled into our school routines. We have also had a significant number of new students in years 1-6 enrol. I hope 2023 is the beginning of a wonderful relationship between our school and new families to our school community.

The month of February sets the trend for a busy first term and there are some key dates for parents to include in their diaries.

On Tuesday this week, parents received information on Compass regarding our 'Meet the Teacher' conversations. The meetings have been scheduled for Monday, February 20th and Tuesday, February 21st after school from 3:30—6:30pm. This meeting provides an opportunity for parents and teachers to meet and introduce themselves, as well as share any information that parents believe may impact upon their child's learning in 2023. Parents can book their preferred conversation time/s. via Compass. Bookings opened yesterday, Wednesday, February 8th at 1.30pm. Bookings will close to parents at 12noon on Monday, February 20th.

The first of our year level newsletters for 2023 will be distributed to parents at the 'Meet the Teacher' conversations. The newsletter will share with parents the key areas their children will be engaging in this term, including reading, writing, mathematics and our inquiry units. As well as curriculum material, important dates for each year level and other important information for parents about some of our school processes, are also included. We hope this assists parents with an understanding of the learning your children will experience during term 1.

This Friday our senior students in years 5 and 6 commence the summer inter-school sport season against other local schools in the district. Our school teams will participate in the sports of cricket, basketball, volleyball, tennis and softball. It was great to see many students have a go at a new sport, particularly the softballers. As well as endeavouring to perform at their best and trying to achieve success, our students are also aware of their responsibilities whenever they represent our school in the wider community. There is an expectation that our students exhibit a strong sense of sportsmanship, respect the umpires and their decision-making in all games and encourage their teammates. We look forward to the enjoyment our students have through their participation, accompanied by excellent attitudes. Thank you to Mr Vann for his organisation and supporting our students in

their preparations for the games. We wish them all the best of luck and fun.

Over the school holiday break, you may have noticed work being completed in our playgrounds. The current works are emergency drainage works. The project has being funded and overseen by the Department of Education and includes larger storm water pipes being installed to enable high volumes of water to exit our site in severe weather events. This project is expected to be completed in the coming weeks. A second drainage project, again funded and overseen by the Department of Education to install drainage across the remainder of the eastern end of the school grounds is expected to begin in term 2. Once completed, we will be able to further develop our playground. Our students have begun to provide their ideas and thoughts on the additions they would like to add to our playground. I look forward to sharing further information on the projects later in the term.

Last week our year 6 students who have aspirations for leadership positions in 2023 collected their leadership applications. Our student leadership team is made up of our two school captains, eight house captains and a number of student representative council captains. As part of the application process, our students need to:

- demonstrate an enthusiasm to lead and encourage our student body to participate and contribute to the ongoing development of our school
- demonstrate and outline their ability to be positive role models for all students
- demonstrate their ability to think and act in ways that reflect our school's core values—how they "live our values"
- be representatives of our school, when required, out of school at community events.

The applications, together with speeches and conversations with the applicants, will be considered for selection by members of our school's leadership team. Parents of year 6 students will be notified of when the student leadership positions will be announced.

Each year our School Council elections take place during the first term. This year we have five parent vacancies. Our School Council plays an important role in the progress and development of our school across many areas including governance, educational directions and policy development and ratification. It also monitors our financial situation and oversees our school's operating budget and expenditure programs. School Council is also a forum where important school community issues that impact upon our school and our students can be discussed and analysed. If you are available and willing to attend a meeting that last 60-90 minutes once a month, have an interest in your child's school and how we can continue to provide an effective and engaging education to our students, this may be an opportunity for you to make a contribution to our school community.








Attention Parents/ Guardians

Please be courteous to our surrounding residents, when parking, dropping or collecting students from school - **obey parking signs**, **do not park in or over driveways**.


We ask that you leave enough time to drop off and pick up children in a safe and legal manner.

Nude Food Fridays



PLPS began their weekly 'Nude Food Fridays' in week 1 of this term.

What is Nude Food? Nude food is food without excess packaging such as extra plastic bags, paper bags, wrappings or cling wrap. The purpose of "Nude Food Fridays" is to promote a healthier environment in the school yard. Having a healthier environment means less rubbish around the schools and it also displays PRIDE in our environment and the importance of keeping it clean and safe!



The benefits of packaging "Nude Food" also includes:

Improve Your Child's Nutrition:

Creating waste free snacks and lunches reduces the consumption of packaged, processed foods and increases the intake of fresh, whole foods. Compared to fresh foods, pre-packaged food often contains more kilojoules, fat, salt and sugar. Avoiding those quick, pre-packaged snacks reduces waste and ensures better nutrition for your child.



Reduce Landfill:

Australia is the second highest producer of waste per person in the western world! School lunches are contributing to this, with the average lunch-toting child generating around 30kg of litter a year. You can do your bit to reduce this by packing a school lunch without including any unnecessary packaging, yoghurt suckers, small tubs, zip-lock bags, paper bags or cling wrap. By reducing the amount of excess packaging this will reduce the amount of waste that needs to go in bins to be sent to landfill.

Save Money:

Avoiding pre-packaged foods and buying foods in bulk can save time and money. Even better, a home-made carrot and apple muffin/frittata/muesli slice will have a much greater nutrient value AND you can control the amount of sugar used, avoiding preservatives and additives completely. By making your own lunchbox goodies, you can then purchase the raw ingredients in bulk too – instead of buying a 6 pack of yoghurts, purchase a large tub and make up individual, leak proof containers for lunch. 




