Principal's Report

The end of term one has provided many opportunities for both students and staff to be involved in a variety of activities.

The year 5 students returned from Sovereign Hill last Thursday, and although the weather wasn't always pleasant, the students had a wonderful time. Monday at Narmbool camp provided our students with opportunities to broaden their knowledge on biodiversity and indigenous culture through art and aquatic sampling. The remaining days were based at Sovereign Hill. There were many highlights, including the evening sound and light show. Being able to join the students at Sovereign Hill and share in their experiences was a delight. The excitement of them panning for gold and their amazement at some of the stories relayed of the times was lovely to see. Our school community can be extremely proud of all students. The manner in which they conducted themselves and their interactions with Sovereign Hill staff and the general public gained much praise and positive feedback for their knowledge and conversation, as well as their courtesy and considerations of others. Well done year 5. Thank you to the staff who attended, enabling an informative and action packed four days.

Last Friday 80 students from year five and six participated in the Summer Sport Lightning Premiership. Our students represented PLPS in the sports of Cricket, Basketball, Volleyball and Tennis. Although a little cold and wet, our students and staff had a very enjoyable day. Congratulations to all the students who participated and consistently demonstrated sportsmanship and teamwork throughout the day. Our tennis teams, both the girls and the boys finished the day champions of their competitions. Well done to both teams. They will have the opportunity to represent our district later in the year. Thank you to Mr Vann and Mr Seton our Physical Education teachers for their organisation of this event, as well other staff members who coached and encouraged teams throughout the day.

It was not only our students who have been representing PLPS proudly, our staff have been busy representing us at some professional learning activities.

Late last year two of our teachers, Monique Olszewski and Aaron Krug were asked and accepted the role of convening the Cardinia Schools Network Marrung Community of Practice. This Community of Practice provides opportunities for teachers across the network to come together to build and share their knowledge and understanding of Koorie Education in our schools. Last Friday, Monique and Aaron led the first CofP for 2023. Congratulations to them both for the work and recognition of the great work they have been involved in over recent years.

Last Thursday and Friday we had a team of four teachers begin their "Leading Mathematics" professional learning program through the Victorian Academy of Teaching and Learning. Matt Lee, Katrina Ross, Emma Dalzotto and Rebecca Weinman will be involved in this program throughout the year, sharing their learning and expertise with all staff and continue to enhance the mathematical experiences for our students.

Year 2 students participated in a Toy Science Inursion last Friday. The incursion provided students with opportunities to enhance and consolidate their learning with a variety of toys from different cultures and throughout history that utilize a range of scientific concepts. One of the highlights the students thoroughly enjoyed was designing, creating and testing their own boats made from recycled materials.

On Monday our Year 3 students travelled to the Melbourne Museum to support their current unit of inquiry, "Victoria Then and Now". They visited a variety of exhibitions to enhance their learning on how Victoria has changed over time. Some points of particular interest to the students were the

exhibitions of 'The Melbourne Story', the dinosaurs and 'Bugs Alive'.

Yesterday morning our basketball courts were a sea of colour with our students in years Prep, One and Two parading their Easter Bonnets for their peers and families. It was great to see many family members come along and join in the celebration and fun. Thank you to Ms Clarkson for enhancing the festivities through her entertaining commentary throughout the parade. Thank you to all our students and families for the time and effort put into creating the lovely bonnets.

Our Easter Raffle was also drawn yesterday and the winners for each of the home groups have been contacted. The list of our winners was posted on Compass yesterday afternoon.

A big thank you to our Parents Association for the collation of the amazing Easter hampers for the raffle and to our school community for supporting this event through donations and the purchase of tickets. The raffle has raised \$3034.15. I look forward to working with our student leaders to discuss how these funds will be used to support initiatives for our students.

Yesterday we conducted our house athletics carnival off site at the Edwin Flack Athletics Track in Berwick. The students in year four, five and six participated in a variety of track and field events throughout the day. Once again, the students really enjoyed using these facilities. The House results are still being calculated and will be shared with the students when they are ready.

The athletics carnival also provides the opportunity for our students to qualify to compete at the District Athletics Carnival being held later in the year.

Thanks again to Mr Seton and Mr Vann for their organisation and preparation that enabled the carnival to proceed very smoothly, together with other staff members. I would also like to extend my thanks to the many parents who attended the athletics day and provided support and encouragement to our students as they competed.

The Fun Run House results were shared with our students at our whole school assembly this morning. They were:

3rd place – Waterford

4th place – Parkway

The points were very close with only 54 point separating 1st to 4th. Congratulations to Creekwood, this being their first win of our Cross Country – Fun Run.

During Term 1, students in Digital Technology have been using a range of skills in the fields of STEAM.

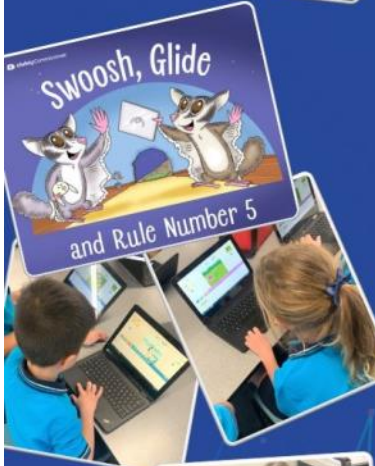
Science.Technology.Engineering.Art.Mathematics.

The students in Prep have been learning about engineering marvels from around the world. They have had a chance to use a range of materials, build individually or in pairs. They showed the resilience and ingenuity of global engineers.

During the sessions they have also been developing their digital skills by using keyboards, touch screens and laptops.

The Year One students have been learning about cyber safety through Swoosh, Glide and Rule Number 5. They have also been learning about device use. They practised mouse and keyboard use, and how to create amazing digital art works.

Year Two students were learning about coding, through loops, repeats and exciting challenges on Code.org which has been a fantastic success. The students have also been finding out about data and machine learning, by teaching an Artificial Intelligence (A.I) Robot how to keep our oceans clean.



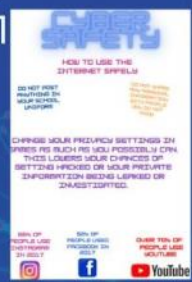
DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY

The Year Three students have been developing their typing skills. The students have also been building their understanding of digital animation, frame rates and coding skills. They have used programs such as Pivot Stick-Figure Animator to bring life to a stick figure as well as Scratch Junior to practice character use, backgrounds, sequencing and dialogue.

The Year Four students started off the term learning about data. They got a chance to practice code breaking skills, problem solving activities and translating into binary language. The students have recently been introduced to circuitry. They have used this understanding to become engineers, working in teams to design and build an electric propeller powered car.

Year Five students have been developing their programming skills and creating a Tamagotchi or electronic pet. They have used coding, debugging and use an online platform to upload their work. The students designed and built their pet a physical body and transferred their code to the Microbit Motherboard.

Year Six students have been demonstrating their design skills using Canva. They have also been developing their understanding of social media and the importance of keeping personal information secure and private. They combined these skills to create social media awareness posters designed for their peer level as an audience.

Tickets are now on sale for our Prep and Year 1 families.

Prices are – Adults \$18 and Children (under 16 years) \$15. Children aged 3 years and under are free when not occupying a seat (sitting on your lap). Tickets can be purchased online, over the phone or in person at the CCC. If you have any queries regarding ticket purchasing, please contact the Cardinia Cultural Centre on 1300 887 624. Their operating hours are Mon-Fri 9am to 5pm. In order to ensure that there are no families left without tickets, a maximum of three tickets in total can be purchased per family over both performances. This decision has been taken to ensure that as many immediate family members as possible can see our children perform. Our venue has a seating capacity of 356. Any tickets that have not been sold during the first round will be available to purchase when a second round sale is advertised on the 1st of May.

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund Applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts for 2023 are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

It is important that funding made available in 2023 supports students to participate in school trips, camps and sporting activities this year rather than being held for future years. This funding can also be used in conjunction with any funding accrued from previous years.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you are new to our school this year or if you would like to apply for the first time, please complete an application form and return it to our school office as soon as possible. **Applications for the CSEF program for 2023 close on 23rd June 2023.**

CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 – General eligibility

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or carer of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one
 - on the first day of Term two
- a) be a holder of one or more of the eligible financially-means tested cards **OR** be a temporary foster parent, and;
- b) submit an application to the school by the due date.

For the list of eligible financially-means tested cards refer to the CSEF Policy:

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with the above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

Special Consideration

A special consideration category exists for

- Families on a bridging visa, temporary protection visa, in community detention or are asylum seeker families
- Students in temporary out of home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/carer concession card being validated successfully with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (30th January 2023) or term two (24th April 2023).

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see:

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents/carers so please register your interest at the school.

1. Complete the PARENT/CARER DETAILS section.

Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.

If you are claiming as a temporary Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.

If you are seeking special consideration, mark this in the form and provide a copy of the relevant documentation.

2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.

3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. **The CSEF program for 2023 closes on the 23rd June 2023**

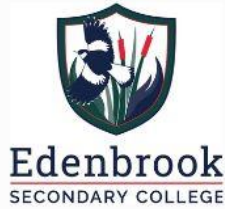
