### **Principal's Report**

Welcome back to all members of our school community after what I hope has been a relaxing and enjoyable break. On behalf of our students and staff, I would like to extend a warm welcome to our four new students who have enrolled at PLPS and are continuing their education at our school.

Term four at PLPS is looking to be an exciting and busy term, with many activities planned as we seek to continue our focus on teaching and learning, and ensuring a successful conclusion to our year.

For our year 6 students, it will be their final term of primary school learning before they embark on the next phase of their educational journey at their respective secondary schools. To commence their final term, many of our year 6 students set their alarms for an early start when they arrived at school on Monday at 6:30am to prepare for their departure to Canberra for their camp this week. The students and staff are currently enjoying a jammed packed week of interesting and fun experiences. I have very much enjoyed spending some time with the campers this week. It was great to see the manner in which our students conducted themselves when visiting the attractions and their questions and interactions with the educators and guides at the attractions. I would like to extend my thanks and appreciation to all staff members for the time and commitment they contributed to enable the camp to take place. We look forward to welcoming them home tomorrow afternoon.

On Tuesday our Year 3 students participated in their 'Hands On Science' Incursion. Students explored the relationships between the Earth, Moon and Sun, including relative sizes and their orbits. Through a variety of hands-on activities, students had the opportunity to gain an understanding of gravity, day and night and Earth's seasons. Students thoroughly enjoyed the day. A highlight for many students was testing their bottle rockets outside.

Following the success at the Pakenham District Day, our girls will represent the school in the year 3/4 All-Star Girls State Hoop Time Basketball Competition on Friday October 13<sup>th</sup> at the Dandenong Basketball Stadium in Dandenong. Families are invited to come along and support our teams at this event.

With the beginning of term 4, it is timely to reflect on the crucial importance of school attendance and punctuality. Our teachers and other support staff will continue to work with all families and our students to maximise their learning, growth and development for the remainder of the 2023 school year.

One of the major influences on whether your child is likely to achieve their potential at school and then later in life, is their attendance patterns at school. Research indicates strongly that those students who are frequently absent or late to school are less likely to achieve the maximum potential with their learning. They are also at risk of becoming disconnected from their peers and this has the potential to impact upon their social development within our school community.

Students who arrive late on a regular basis are missing out on 'Morning Circle' time that often helps to make connections with their peers and teachers. Students are also missing out on important conversations about the day's learning program and instruction. Students who are frequently absent do not have the same opportunities to develop important teacher/student relationships which are a key feature of our student support. Also, students who are regularly late or absent may become socially disadvantaged as their friends and peers continue to develop friendship groups with others in their absence. Your child's desire to be punctual and attend school will be influenced by many factors. Our school will continue to support all of our students and their families. If you are experiencing difficulties with your child around attending school, please contact the school so we can support you and continue to assist your child with their learning and development.

You are the most important person in your child's life and you can assist your child to be an excellent school attendee by:

- helping your child to be organised with their time and being prepared for school
- setting up routines around school mornings
- aim to have your child at school every day, unless they are unwell
- plan holidays during end of term breaks
- instill the "value" of education by speaking about the importance of regular attendance
- contact our school if you require support or assistance.
   Remember "Every Day Counts"

The beginning of term 4 does signify the need for all our students to be wearing their sunhats. The wearing of sunhats is an excellent habit to develop and one that we strongly encourage at school. Although our current weather is wet rather than sunny, I would ask all parents to assist us in developing this important life skill. If parents require a school sunhat for their child, they may be purchased from the PSW store in Officer or at the school office.

# Cardinia Division Athletics Carnival 2023



Every child arriving after the 9am bell must come to the school office to collect a Late Pass to take to their teacher.


### **EARLY LEAVERS**
