Principal's Report

Preparations for our annual Art Show are now in the final stage. On Tuesday November 28th, we are looking forward to exploring our school grounds to admire a combination of indoor and outdoor exhibits. Our Open Afternoon will begin at 3.30pm. Upon arrival guests will be presented with a map with a suggested route to walk around the show and this year we are offering families the opportunity to complete a scavenger hunt. This will take you on a guided journey to find all the 2D and 3D artworks on display. We hope you can join us and we look forward to celebrating our students' achievements in the Visual Arts program.

Last Wednesday I had the pleasure of accompanying our Prep students to the Chesterfield Farm for their excursion. At the farm, our students had the opportunity to milk a cow, feed some animals, watch a sheep dog in action and enjoyed a tractor ride around the farm to view all the animals. The feeding of the animals created many giggles and shrills as the animals tickled their palms whilst trying to gather the feed from their hands. The experience enhanced the students learning of their current inquiry unit of living and non-living things. They enjoyed being able to pat and feel the different coverings of the animals and asked many questions of the farmers. It was a very enjoyable day had by all.

Recently our year 3 and 4 students had the opportunity to participate in a coloring competition being offered by our local State MP Emma Vulin. The students were invited to submit submissions that would be featured on the Season's Greetings Card, which are to be distributed across the Pakenham electorate. We had 25 students participate and develop designs. Recently we were notified that three of our students' designs had been selected to be used for the greeting cards. Congratulations to Piper in year 3 and Ruby and Lily in year 4. Thank you to Mrs Allen who coordinated this activity and provided the time for our students to partake in this opportunity. We look forward to seeing their designs being circulated in our local community.

We are currently conducting our formal transition program that supports our new prep students prepare for the start of their formal schooling. This week we had many of our 2024 students attend, with the hope that all students enrolled for Prep next year at PLPS can participate in these important sessions. At the conclusion of the sessions next

week, the students will collect a bag containing a picture story book and other helpful items they can use at home.

Yesterday our girls and boys tennis teams competed at the Southern Regional Tennis Tournament. The standard of tennis was extremely high at this stage and our students did a great job competing throughout the competition. Well done to all students for their effort and success.

Last Friday we had 43 students from years three & four represent PLPS in 5 teams at the Officer District T20 Blast Cricket tournament. Our students played 3-4 modified games of cricket, demonstrating great sportsmanship and fun on a very warm day. Thank you to Mr Vann for organizing the day, together with other staff and parents who supported our students at the competition.

This year we will attempt to once again host our Christmas Concert, weather permitting. Invitations have been extended to all family members to come along for the afternoon performance. All classes and the PLPS choir will be performing. The concert has been scheduled for Thursday, December 14th and will begin at 1.30pm and conclude at 3.00pm. The school gates will open at 1.20pm for family and friends to enter and set up their camping chairs or picnic rugs in the designated area on the basketball courts. The Christmas raffle will be drawn at the conclusion of the concert. Tickets for the raffle will be distributed very soon.

A reminder our last curriculum day for 2023 will be tomorrow Friday, November 17th. On this day the staff will be participating in the last day of the Berry Street Education Model professional learning. Throughout the year, our participation in this program has reinforced and further developed our understanding and repertoire of strategies to assist all students with their own wellbeing and personal development.








Opportunity for businesses

IMPORTANT MESSAGE Sharing of food

When food items are being used within the teaching and learning programs at school, communications will be posted on Compass to parents and carers outlining the food items being used. Parents will have the option to discuss implications for their child or opt out of these activities.


