Principal's Report

Recently, our year 6 students who have aspirations for leadership positions in 2024 collected and prepared their leadership applications. Our student leadership team is made up of our two school captains, eight house captains and a number of student representative council captains. As part of the application process, our students need to:

- demonstrate an enthusiasm to lead and encourage our student body to participate and contribute to the ongoing development of our school
- demonstrate and outline their ability to be positive role models for all students
- demonstrate their ability to think and act in ways that reflect our school's core values—how they "live our values"
- be representatives of our school, when required, out of school at community events.

Students also had the opportunity to share with us something they would be interested in and be willing to lead to further develop or improve our school.

The applications, together with speeches and conversations with the applicants, will be considered for selection by members of our school's leadership team. Parents of year 6 students will be notified of when the student leadership positions will be announced.

Once again in 2024, our school newsletter each fortnight will be showcasing the achievements and reflections of our students as they grow and develop though our learning programs and events at PLPS. Each fortnight will feature a particular year level cohort with illustrations of students' work, student reflections or photos and captions of what the children have achieved and enjoyed.

The first showcase, in our newsletter this week, is our Prep cohort of students. It was lovely to see the excitement and smiles of our Prep students enjoying their first week at school. Our Prep children have had a positive start to the year and are settling well into the routines and structures associated with attending school, as well as their learning program.

A reminder that our Prep students will be attending school each day of the week, starting as of next Monday, February 19th.

Each year our School Council elections take place during the first term. This year we have four parent vacancies. Our School Council plays an important role in the progress and development of our school across many areas including governance, educational directions and policy development and ratification. It also monitors our financial situation and oversees our school's operating budget and expenditure programs. School Council is also a forum where important school community issues that impact upon our school and our students can be discussed and analysed. If you are available and willing to attend a meeting that last 60-90 minutes once a month, have an interest in your child's school and how we can continue to provide an effective and engaging education to our students, this may be an opportunity for you to make a contribution to our school community.

Next month our students in years 3 and 5 will sit the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). The students will complete the assessments online, except for a paper test for year 3 writing. Our students will participate in tests in writing, reading, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The assessments will begin on Wednesday, March 13th and conclude by Friday, March 22nd.

The tests, in these various disciplines provides parents with an understanding of how individual students are performing in each curriculum area at the time of testing.

Pamphlets detailing further information for parents, including links to the public demonstration site, will be distributed to our year 3 and year 5 families next week via Compass. If you have any questions about your child's participation in the assessments, please contact the school.

NAPLAN testing is just one aspect of our school's assessment and reporting program and this NAPLAN data complements assessment that is conducted on an ongoing basis by our teaching staff in the learning spaces.

Individual student reports will be returned to the school later in 2024 which are then distributed to parents and students.

With the warmer weather upon us, can I urge all parents to support our school by ensuring that their children have a sunhat with them at school, particularly during first term when the UV element is at its highest. We strongly encourage all children to develop this important life skill but require the support of parents to provide the sunhats. Sunhats can be purchased from our school office. Thank you for your assistance with this very important matter.

School Hours and Pick Up

Our school hours are between 9am and 3.15pm each day. We understand that due to traffic and other unforeseen circumstances parents/carers may not be able to pick up their child/children on time. If you are running late to pick up and it is after 3.30pm your child/children who are waiting in the school yard will be asked to wait in our school admin building, as there are no teachers on yard duty after this time. If parents are aware that they will be running late, could you please advise the school office before 3pm or as soon as possible. The school sends all the orders in together, and then the books are delivered to the school. The books will then be delivered to your child's classroom to take home.

Furthermore, the school receives free books from Book Club that allow us to regularly update our class and school libraries with just-published and favourite books.

There is no obligation to order, but I know of no better way to encourage reading than to give children the opportunity of choosing their own books.
