Principal's Report

The month of March is certainly proving to be a busy one at PLPS with many of our students participating in a variety of opportunities in addition to our teaching and learning programs.

On Tuesday this week, Mrs Webster and I had the pleasure of accompanying our twenty two student leaders into the city to attend the Youth Leadership Conference conducted by YLAA, Youth Leadership Academy Australia, held at the Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre. Dream and Lead is a one-day, highly engaging event designed to support primary school students in discovering their leadership potential, whilst providing them with strong foundations to succeed. The conference aims to equip our students with the skills and confidence to be change-makers in our school and our community, together with supporting their development for a future in leadership. We had a very enjoyable and insightful day.

Last Thursday all our students started their three-week Cultural Dance Program with the Footsteps Dance Company. The program has been organised as part of our recognition and celebration of Harmony Week. Students from all year levels are participating in the program each Thursday learning dances from a variety of different cultures. The final week of the program will be Thursday, March 21st, coinciding with Harmony Week. On this day, students are encouraged to wear a splash of orange with their uniforms to celebrate Harmony Day.

Last Wednesday, March 6th, nominations closed for positions on our 2024 School Council. I am pleased to announce the parents who will serve our school community as parent representatives on School Council this year. Our elected parent representatives and community members are Lisa Fry, Samantha Scott, Rebecca Greenway, Eve Rook, Adriana Fitzgerald, Nicole McIntyre, Stephanie Webel and Amanda Loftus.

The staff representatives who will join me as our school representatives are Matthew Lee, Margaret Krstevski, Steven Runting and Katrina Ross.

I would like to welcome our new councillors and look forward to their contributions as we continue to provide our students with an engaging education. Our first meeting of the new school council will be Monday, March 18th at 6pm.

A sincere thank you to Amy Mackenzie for her time and service provided to our school community during her extended time on school council, it has been much appreciated.

Information for our year 5 and year 6 camp was posted on Compass recently.

Our year 5 students will be attending The Old Priory School Camp in Beechworth from Tuesday May 28th to Friday May 31st. The camp will provide our students with learning experiences directly related to our history inquiry topic. This unit of work enables our students to explore events that have shaped our nation's culture, as well as examining the impact of immigration on our country's growth and development. They will have the opportunity to explore the historic town of Beechworth, reflect on the economic impact of the gold rush on Australia's early economy, investigate early methods of communication and learn about the life and times of Ned Kelly. Parents are asked to indicate whether their child will be attending the camp. This can be completed through the consent form on Compass,

together with the payment of the deposit, due tomorrow, March 15th. Our year 6 students will be travelling to Canberra from November 18th to 22nd. This camp provides our students with an outstanding opportunity to experience learning directly associated with their inquiry unit of work, in civics and citizenship. As part of the camp program, students will visit a number of buildings, sites and attractions associated with the development and role of government in Australia. To assist with our planning and the financial commitment to the camp, parents are asked to indicate whether their child will be attending the camp. This can be completed through the consent form on Compass, together with the payment of the deposit, due on April 26th.

One of the ways that some students can be supported to participate in these invaluable learning experiences is through the Camps, Sport and Excursions Fund (CSEF). This funding is provided to support eligible families to cover the costs or part of the expenses of excursions and incursions, camps and sporting events and activities. If a parent holds a valid concession card, Department of Veteran Affairs card or is a foster parent, they may be eligible for CSEF. The funds will be paid to our school and can be used towards expenses of authorised events. Each primary child would be allocated \$150. Application forms are available from our school office or may be downloaded from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

One of our whole school events taking place early next term is our FUN RUN, which is our house cross-country running event. Information about this event was posted on Compass yesterday, including how to create online profiles for the fundraising component, thus qualify for the prizes on offer. If you have any questions or would like any assistance with this process, please call the school office. All students from Prep to Year 6 will represent their house at this event as they compete for the PLPS House Cross-Country shield. Students are encouraged to wear their house colours for this event. The FUN RUN is scheduled for early next term, Monday, April 22nd.

To help our students prepare for this event, Mr Seton & Mr Vann have organised time before school on Thursdays to conduct the Runners' Club. The Runners club involves running and fitness training with Mr Vann and Mr Seton. Students can meet at 8.20am on the synthetic grass and training will conclude at 8:40am. Parents are invited to get involved and bring along their runners and join in our runners club. Thank you to our staff for their continued commitment to supporting our students.

With school holidays fast approaching, I would like to advise all families that OSHClub is providing their vacation care program for our students at PLPS. Any inquiries may be directed to OSHClub on 0438 559 017.

On Thursday, March 28th, term one 2024 will conclude at the earlier dismissal time of 2.30pm. Parents need to make the necessary arrangements for the collection of their children at this earlier dismissal time. Our OSHClub will be operating from this earlier time to support parents and families who require this service.

IMPORTANT MESSAGE Sharing of food

Sharing of food items is NOT permitted at PLPS, due to reasons associated with health, safety and family beliefs and choice. Food cannot be distributed to other students: this includes food items to celebrate birthdays.

Non-food items can be shared for birthdays, if so desired.

When food items are being used within the teaching and learning programs at school, communications will be posted on Compass to parents and carers outlining the food items being used. Parents will have the option to discuss implications for their child or opt out of these activities.



School Hours and Pick Up

Our school hours are between 9am and 3.15pm each day. We understand that due to traffic and other unforeseen circumstances parents/carers may not be able to pick up their child/children on time. Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one, or;
- · on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- * A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund</u> (CSEF): Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on 29 January 2024 and/or 15 April 2024.

Payment amounts

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- · Primary school student rate: \$150.00 per year.
- · Secondary school student rate: \$250.00 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: <u>Camps</u>, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF): Payment amounts | education.vic.gov.au

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

How to complete the application form

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
 - Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
 - If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2024 closes at the end of term two 2024 – Friday 28th June 2024.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.






