Principal's Report

On Tuesday 5th of March, Ms Flentjar and our school captains Kythea and Jayden, alongside Year 6 students Harper and Charlotte, attended the Cardinia Network Koorie/Cultural Student Leaders Conference at the Council Chambers in Officer. Over the course of the day, the students were provided an opportunity to connect with school leaders from a number of primary schools in our network, participating in a range of fun games and activities. The students enjoyed a visit from Cr Jack Kowarzik, our local mayor, who shared his journey in becoming the mayor of Cardinia Shire. Highlights from our leaders were; Kythea - "Pete's acknowledgment to country was a highlight for me. It was great to learn about how we can make our own acknowledgements to country more personalised and having an opportunity to draft our own". Jayden - "When you are an effective leader, it's not just about what you do, it's about how you lead your team". *Harper* - "I enjoyed hearing from others their journey to leadership and learning from their stories". Charlotte - "I liked the tour around the council chambers and learning about what is involved in each persons' role". On Tuesday this week, two of our staff members were enacting their leadership capabilities through facilitating and convening the 2024 Cardinia Schools Network Marrung Community of Practice. 


Science

For our science unit, we are discovering the effects of light using shadow art. To understand the concepts of reflection and refraction of light and colours, we used kaleidoscopes to visualise these behaviours of light. By the end of the unit, students created a piece of shadow art using a combination of opaque, translucent, and transparent materials.

Wonder

Wonder is the mentor text wea er reading this term in the Year 5 space. Kindness is the main theme of the book Wonder, and it helps Year 5 understand that a small simple act of kindness can make a big difference. It teaches a powerful message about kindness, tolerance, and acceptance. We are applying these themes within our SEL (Social and Emotional Learning) lessons, providing examples and scenarios that some students may face themselves throughout the year.






I really like how there are different character perspectives in the book.

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Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one, or;
- · on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- * A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund</u> (CSEF): Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on 29 January 2024 and/or 15 April 2024.

Payment amounts

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- · Primary school student rate: \$150.00 per year.
- · Secondary school student rate: \$250.00 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: <u>Camps</u>, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF): Payment amounts | education.vic.gov.au

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

How to complete the application form

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
 - Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
 - If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2024 closes at the end of term two 2024 – Friday 28th June 2024.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.


