## **Principal's Report**

Our students and staff have had an enjoyable week engaging in activities promoting and celebrating the learning at PLPS throughout education week. The cross-age STEM projects involving collaboration in designs and construction provided opportunities for students to learn with different students and staff. It was great to see the co-operation and the animated conversations as they engaged in these activities. Photos have been collated and displayed on the library windows illustrating the highlights of our Education Week. A special edition newsletter will also be produced and posted tomorrow, sharing our highlights with the school community.

I would like to thank everyone who has taken the opportunity to visit our Book Fair which has been set up in our school library. This is a great opportunity to purchase some books for your children to read. Thank you also to those people who have purchased a book and then kindly donated it to our library collection. We will be very pleased to acknowledge your generosity with a note inside the book. Any funds that are raised through our Book Fair are used to purchase further titles that can be placed in our library for students to read and borrow. Tomorrow morning will be the final opportunity for our students and parents to visit the Book Fair. Thank you to everyone for your support this week.

On Wednesday last week, we held our Mother's Day stall, allowing students to purchase gifts for mums or other significant figures in their lives. A special thank you to the members of our Parents and Friends group for their preparation of this event and the many parent helpers who assisted throughout the running of the stall. A thank you also to our educators from our OSHClub who also came along to help out with the stall. Your support is greatly appreciated.

Last Friday, May 10<sup>th</sup> we had 39 students representing PLPS at the District Cross Country at Toomuc Recreation Reserve. The students in the 9/10 year age group ran 2km and students in the 11 and 12/13 year age group ran a 3km course. Even though it was a tough event and conditions were muddy, our competitors put in their best effort and were proud of their results. We have four students who have qualified for the Cardinia Division Cross Country event being held on May 28<sup>th</sup>. We wish Chloe and Goran in year 5, and Natasha and Liam in year 6 all the best for their next event.

Recently a group of year 6 students represented PLPS at the St Margaret's Netball Tournament. Our team participated in the mixed competition competing against other schools from the Casey and Cardinia area. The team won six out of seven games in the rounds and played off in the finals to be placed 3<sup>rd</sup> from sixteen teams. Well done to all the players and thank you to the coaches and families who assisted on the day.

Our second school performance in 2024 will be at the Cardinia Cultural Centre starring our Prep and year 1 students. Children and staff have been working hard in Performing Arts classes learning and rehearsing their songs for "Sunshine and Rainbows" being performed on the evenings of Monday, June 17<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday, June 18<sup>th</sup>. The first of our year level camps is fast approaching. Our year 5 students will depart for their four-day camp to Beechworth in north-east Victoria on May 28th. This camp provides our children with outstanding experiences that enrich and enhance their current learning in their history inquiry unit "My Place", in a town renowned for its role in key events in our nation's history. It also provides several opportunities for our students to demonstrate their personal development and how our school's values can be used when our children are in the wider community.

One of our key priorities is to ensure all staff remain aware of and informed about information and research around teaching practices and approaches that impact positively upon our students' learning.

One of the key sets of data which enables us to evaluate how effectively we are achieving this goal is student feedback. One of the major tools we use to gather this important data is the Student Attitudes to School survey which is completed annually by our students in years 4-6.

This survey is conducted online and will provide our school leadership team with important information that will be considered when we are making future decisions around staffing, professional learning and development, resourcing of future programs and curriculum development. The survey's framework is developed around the following key domains:

- effective and engaging teaching practices
- teacher/student relationships
- student learner characteristics
- social engagement
- · student safety

Students have completed the survey over the past two weeks. Once our student responses are completed and aggregated, we will be able to access our school's report to inform our discussions. I look forward to sharing the findings from the survey with our school community.



#### Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

#### Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible\* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one, or;
- · on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- \* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund</u> (CSEF): <u>Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au</u>

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

#### Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

#### **Eligibility Date**

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on 29 January 2024 and/or 15 April 2024.

#### Payment amounts

#### **CSEF** payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- · Primary school student rate: \$150.00 per year.
- · Secondary school student rate: \$250.00 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: <u>Camps</u>, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF): Payment amounts | education.vic.gov.au

**Foundation and Year 7 government school students** who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

#### How to complete the application form

#### NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
   Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
  - If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2024 closes at the end of term two 2024 – Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June 2024.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.




#### ENROL IN KEYBOARD AND GUITAR LESSONS IN TERM 2
