# **Principal's Report**

On Tuesday, our staff participated in a Common Professional Practice Day. In 2024 one of our Annual Implementation Plan key improvement strategies is to 'Embed a whole school approach to teaching and building teacher capacity in Writing'. The staff centred their work around a mentor text we have been reading and working together to analyse and reflect upon how PLPS writing programs could be enhanced. The day provided an opportunity to ensure alignment and common understanding through each of the year levels, together with planning future units of work and the teacher practices to be used and further explored to support and assess our students in their writing program.

Throughout term 2 many of our Year 6 and 5 students have been participating in the Interschool Sport program. Tomorrow will see the culmination of this program with students having the opportunity to compete in the Pakenham District Lightning Premiership Day, weather permitting. We will have teams competing in the round robin events in the following sports: Football and Tee-ball at Toomuc Reserve, Soccer at IYY Reserve in Pakenham and Netball at Cardinia Life Sports Stadium. We wish all our teams an enjoyable day in their full day competitions. Parents are encouraged to attend the competitions and support our teams.

As we are nearing the end of second term, the dates for our Junior Concert "Sunshine and Rainbows", are drawing closer. This event will comprise of two performances being held over two evenings at the Cardinia Cultural Centre, Monday, June 17<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday, June 18<sup>th</sup>, commencing at 7:00pm. Our Prep and Year 1 students are currently preparing at rehearsals with great energy and enthusiasm under the direction of our Performing Arts teachers, Ms Windust and Mr Lyon. Thank you once again to parents and families for supporting our Performing Arts program through the provision of costumes for the children and the purchase of tickets. The performances for both evenings are selling quickly. The limited number of tickets still available will be released in the second-round ticket sale as of tomorrow, Friday, June 14<sup>th</sup>. We look forward to enjoying entertaining performances from our students.

On Monday afternoon, June 24<sup>th</sup>, our students' semester one reports will be available to all families to download from Compass. These reports outline the growth and development achieved academically and in personal development over the course of the first semester this year.

Thank you to those parents who have accepted our offer and booked a time to participate in our mid-year student led or parent/teacher conversations being conducted on Wednesday, June 26<sup>th</sup>, commencing at 11:00am and concluding at 7:00pm. Bookings remain open and can be completed via Compass for parents who have not yet secured a time. The student led conferences and parent /teacher conversations provide an opportunity for students, teachers and parents to celebrate semester one achievements, together with an understanding and outline of the goals and future learning throughout semester two.

Please note that on Wednesday, when our parent/teacher conversations are held, students do not attend school. If parents require assistance with childcare on the day, our OSHClub will be operating a full day program between their normal operating hours of 6.30am to 6.30pm.

An important reminder to all year 6 students and families for confirming participation in our year 6 camp to Canberra. Although the camp is in November, final student numbers attending camp need to be communicated to the camp staff early next term. With this timeline fast approaching, please ensure a response has been enacted via Compass for all students no later than **Friday**, **June 28**<sup>th</sup>. This is either providing consent, together with the corresponding payments to secure a place or declining the offer. Further payments can be made throughout term 3. Final payments for this camp are due no later than September 16<sup>th</sup>. If you have any difficulties with this process, please call our school office for assistance.

Preparations have begun for our year 3 camp being conducted at Phillip Island Adventure Camp in term 3. The camp is scheduled for Wednesday August 28<sup>th</sup> to Friday August 30<sup>th</sup>. Detailed information including the rationale and the activities the students will have the opportunity to participate in, together with costings and payment options have been communicated to all year 3 families via Compass. To assist with our planning, can parents please consent or decline the offer to attend camp.

At the conclusion of term 2, one of our Prep teachers, Ms Ashley Clarkson will be leaving us for a period of time, as she commences her maternity leave. We wish her all the best as she starts her family. Ms Kathryn Muscat, a current PLPS staff member, will join Ms Kirsten Andrews as the home group teachers for Prep C for the remainder of 2024.

Term 2 will conclude on Friday, June 28<sup>th</sup>. Please note that **school will finish at the earlier time of 2:30pm.** Parents are requested to make the necessary arrangements to have their child collected at this earlier time. Our OSHClub after school program will be operating from this earlier time for those parents who require this service.

# Prep & Year 1 MUSIC

  of evaluating concession card services or confirming eligibility for assistance.

#### Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

#### Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible\* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or;
- · on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

\* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund</u> (CSEF): Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

#### Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

#### **Eligibility Date**

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on **29 January 2024 and/or 15 April 2024**.

#### Payment amounts

#### CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$150.00 per year.
- · Secondary school student rate: \$250.00 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: <u>Camps</u>, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF): Payment amounts | education.vic.gov.au

**Foundation and Year 7 government school students** who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

#### How to complete the application form

#### NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section. Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
   If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2024 closes at the end of term two 2024 – Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June 2024.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.
