#### **Principal's Report**

At our whole school assembly yesterday, our Community SRC Leaders Kythea and Harper shared with our students the significance and importance of ANZAC day and the importance of appreciating the privileges we enjoy and to never take them for granted. We also remembered the families of those who have served and sacrificed, remembering to honour the Anzacs not just with words, but with our actions - by living lives of courage, compassion, and service to others.

The House results for our Athletics Carnival and Fun Run were also revealed at our assembly. Our students had been eagerly awaiting to hear the tally of points for each of the houses.

Congratulations to all students who have participated in both of our major sporting events. School teams for the district carnivals for cross country and athletics will be generated from the results of these events.

During term two, the students in Year 4 are looking at Physical and Chemical sciences during their Inquiry learning sessions. Last Tuesday the students participated in an incursion facilitated by Hands on Science to further build students' skills and knowledge. Students investigated, through experiments, the impact of forces and movement on everyday items. They were provided opportunities to predict, test, collect data and discuss results. A popular experiment involved students using an electric soccer ball to test the friction of various surfaces.

One of the major events in our second term calendar is Education Week, where we have the opportunity to celebrate and acknowledge the achievements of our students. This year Education Week is Monday, May 13<sup>th</sup> to Friday, May 17<sup>th</sup>. The theme for 2024 is "Spotlight on STEM" and highlights the importance of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) in our everyday lives, in the classroom and beyond.

Students will be participating in a variety of activities throughout the week. An Education Week special edition newsletter will also be produced showcasing our students' achievements. A flyer with further details will be posted on Compass when the program for the week has been finalised.

Once again, we will be conducting our Lamont Book Fair throughout Education Week. Students and families have the opportunity to purchase quality literature to read and enjoy together at home. Families may also like to purchase a book to donate to our school

library. Any donations will be acknowledged with a label placed inside the book.

The **Book Fair** will be open each day during Education Week from 8:30am-9:00am and 3:15pm-4:00pm in our school library. Please come along and enjoy browsing through the range of books for sale.

#### Staff Carpark


Our school carpark is for staff parking between 8.30am and 3.45pm on school days by order of the School Council.


During these times parents are not permitted to park in the school carpark.



#### Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

#### Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible\* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one, or;
- · on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- \* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund</u> (CSEF): Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

#### Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

#### **Eligibility Date**

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on 29 January 2024 and/or 15 April 2024.

#### Payment amounts

#### **CSEF** payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- · Primary school student rate: \$150.00 per year.
- · Secondary school student rate: \$250.00 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: <u>Camps</u>, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF): Payment amounts | education.vic.gov.au

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

#### How to complete the application form

#### NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
  - Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
  - If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2024 closes at the end of term two 2024 – Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June 2024.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.

## IMPORTANT MESSAGE Sharing of food

Sharing of food items is NOT permitted at PLPS, due to reasons associated with health, safety and family beliefs and choice. Food cannot be distributed to other students: this includes food items to celebrate birthdays.

Non-food items can be shared for birthdays, if so desired.

When food items are being used within the teaching and learning programs at school, communications will be posted on Compass to parents and carers outlining the food items being used. Parents will have the option to discuss implications for their child or opt out of these activities.






#### ENROL IN KEYBOARD AND GUITAR LESSONS IN TERM 2
