Principal's Report

On behalf of our staff, I would like to thank the parents and carers who accepted our invitation and took the opportunity to meet with our teachers on Monday and Tuesday afternoon last week to discuss their child and the 2025 school year ahead. Research consistently indicates that the partnership between school and home enhances the learning and wellbeing of our children. Thus, our teachers appreciate parents informing them and sharing information that may have an impact upon our students' learning, as well as the opportunity to meet parents to begin the learning relationship with each family. If at any stage you would like to have further meetings, please call our school office to organise a mutually convenient time.

On Monday evening our School Council conducted its first meeting for 2025. A number of items of business were discussed at the meeting. Foremost amongst the items was the tabling of the 2025 Annual Implementation Plan (AIP). This document outlines our key implementation strategies that we will be focusing on during this year and reflects the longer-term strategic priorities contained in our new School Strategic Plan. The strategies are based around two core areas of our school's operations:

1. Student Learning
2. Student Wellbeing

The key implementation strategies we are focusing on for student learning in 2025 are; reviewing and embedding our school wide instructional model ensuring alignment with the Victorian Learning and Teaching Model (VTLM 2.0), continuing to further develop our understanding of student learning and the implementation of effective teaching practices within each of the instructional model elements. In student wellbeing the focus is continuing to embed a consistent approach to supporting positive behaviour and further developing a strategy to support students sense of confidence and connectedness.

As well as specifying these areas targeted for development, our plan outlines how we will allocate resources to enable our work to be undertaken effectively and how we will monitor progress and any targets or milestones which will provide a gauge to evaluate our degrees of achievement. I look forward to sharing further information with our school community regarding our AIP as the year unfolds.

As outlined in our last newsletter, nominations are now open for the 2025 School Council. There are still vacancies for parent representatives. If you are interested and would like further information, please contact me at school on 5940 9532.

The first of our 2025 school performances will be at the Cardinia Cultural Centre starring our Year 2, 3 and 4 students. The Dance Concert "Dance Like an Animal" will comprise of three performances being held over two days at the Cardinia Cultural Centre. Monday, March 31st has 2 performances: one at 11:30am and the other at 7:00pm. The third performance is on the evening of Tuesday, April 1st commencing at 7:00pm. Our students are currently preparing in their Performing Arts classes with great energy and enthusiasm under the direction of our Performing Arts teachers, Ms Windust and Ms Dahmen.

to purchasing tickets. For all shows at the CCC, tickets need to be purchased through their ticketing system. This can be done online, via phone or in person at the CCC. For further information please contact CCC on 1300 887 624. Their operating hours are Monday to Friday, 9am to 5pm.

A reminder that Tuesday, 11th March we are conducting our annual School Fun Run and House Cross Country event for all students in years Prep to 6. Through their participation, all the students contribute points to their house total. Students are encouraged to come along in their house colours, to add to the atmosphere and fun.

As outlined in the last newsletter, this is also a fundraising event. I would like to sincerely thank our school community for the fundraising efforts and contributions so far. I look forward to sharing with our school community the final figure raised and how the funds can be used to support our students learning and improvements within our school grounds. I would like to thank Mr Vann and Mr Seton for their organisation.

Attendance – Unexplained Absences

All Victorian government schools are required to contact parents/carers as soon as practicable on the same day of an unexplained student absence. If your child is absent on a particular day and you have not contacted the school to explain why, the absence will be marked as unexplained, and a Compass text notification will be sent to you asking you to notify the school to explain why your child is absent.

To update your child's absence, you can use one of the following methods:

- 1. Online:** please log the absence directly via Compass.
- 2. Telephone:** please call the school on 5940-9532 and let the office know your child's name, class, date of absences and reason.
- 3. Email:** please email the school at pakenham.lakeside.ps@education.vic.gov.au and provide your child's name, class, date of absences and reason.

Notifying the school of your child's absence either prior to, or on the day that they will be away, helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of children and will fulfil your legal responsibility.

If your child's absence remains unexplained an email will be sent from school outlining the day/s your child has been absent from school and requesting a reason for the absence/s.

Please remember to label your hats too!



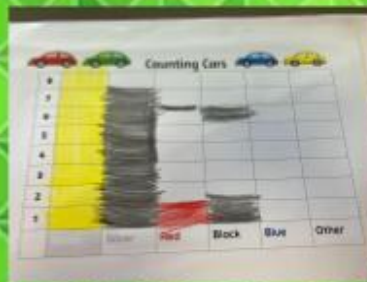
MATHS

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund Applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts for 2025 are \$154 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

It is important that funding made available in 2025 supports students to participate in school trips, camps and sporting activities this year rather than being held for future years. This funding can also be used in conjunction with any funding accrued from previous years.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments;** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances;** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Please complete an application form and return it to our school office along with a copy of your relevant card (your card can be copied at the office). **Applications for the CSEF program for 2025 close on Friday 4th July 2025.**

Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 – Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one; or
- on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder; or
- b) Be a temporary foster parent; and
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: [Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund \(CSEF\): Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au](#)

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students' attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink (see [Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund \(CSEF\): Policy | education.vic.gov.au](#)).

Payment amounts

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child. Please refer to the policy for the current rates.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: [Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund \(CSEF\): Payment amounts | education.vic.gov.au](#)

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

How to complete the application form

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.

- Information regarding my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund may be disclosed to DFFH and/or State Schools Relief for the purpose of evaluating concession card services or confirming eligibility for assistance.

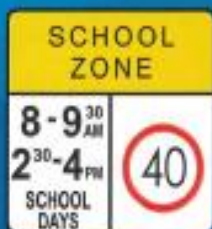

School Zone Safety Information

Understanding the signs around school zones



40km/h sign

All school speed limits across the State are clearly signposted. Look out for the speed signs near schools and slow down to improve safety for children.



No parking

It is important that you do not park in any area where this sign is displayed.



Children crossing

When the flags are displayed at a children's crossing, you must stop for pedestrians who are waiting to cross or who have started crossing. You must remain stopped until the crossing is clear. These rules apply even if there is no crossing supervisor.



No stopping

No stopping means you must not stop at the kerb for any reason.



Yellow edge lines

Must not stop or park your vehicle next to a continuous yellow edge line.

Understanding the rules at school crossings

- Please keep the children's crossing clear.
- Parking is not allowed within 20m before a school crossing or 10m after the crossing (unless otherwise signposted). Parking within this area makes it difficult for children and the crossing supervisor to get a clear view of the road.
- It is illegal to double park your car, ie. you are not allowed to stop next to a parked car.

What you can do to ensure school zones remain safe

- Supervise children in or near traffic.
- Consider walking or cycling with your child to and from school.
- Respect the road rules and parking signs.
- Wait on the same side of the road as your child, to avoid your child dashing across the road to meet you.
- Get your child into the habit of using the car's kerbside doors, away from the traffic.
