Principal's Report

A very warm welcome back to school for another productive and exciting term of teaching and learning. There are many additional opportunities for our students to look forward to throughout this term, including, camps, swimming program, incursions, excursions, sporting events and school performances. On behalf of our community, I would like to extend a warm welcome to our new students and their families who have commenced their schooling at PLPS this term.


With the beginning of Term 2, our 2026 enrolment process has commenced. We have already had a significant number of enquiries, particularly around Prep enrolments and the process about enrolling their child at PLPS. Application forms and enrolments packs are now available for collection from our general office. We will also be conducting school tours and information sessions for parents throughout the term. Interested parents are asked to contact our office on 5940 9532 to register their attendance to visit and view our school on their preferred date.

Next week we will be conducting our House Athletics carnival off site at Edwin Flack Athletics track in Berwick. The students in year four, five and six will participate in a variety of track and field events throughout the day. The athletics carnival provides the opportunity for our students to qualify to compete at the District Athletics Carnival being held later in the year. All students are encouraged to wear their house colours and dress appropriately for the weather conditions. A hat, sunscreen, jumper and/or coat would be advisable. Students are asked to pack their snack, lunch and water for the day. No lunch orders will be available on this day for students in year four, five or six.

Our Year two swimming program will commence at Cardinia Life, Pakenham next week. The students will be participating in an eight-day program concluding on Friday 9th May. Information pertaining to dates and items required for students to bring have been communicated with families via Compass. There is no cost for the swimming program, as this is currently being subsidised by the Department of Education.

On Friday 9th May, our senior students in years five and six will commence the winter inter-school sport season against other local schools in the district. The competition will be conducted on Friday mornings throughout Term 2. Our school teams will participate in the sports of netball, soccer, football and t-ball.

Over the term break we have been fortunate enough to progress with grounds development work that continue to enhance the aesthetics and functionality of our school environment. Our front garden area leading to the school office has been transformed and is looking great. We have also had many outdoor floor installations installed by *Edumarking*. These include the relining of our basketball courts and multiple activity stations spread around the school. It has been great to see our students engage with these additions during their break times. There are still some pieces to be added so watch out for these colourful new additions!







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There is some construction work being undertaken from next week, to replace the external ramp between our year 3 and 4 learning spaces. This requires Gate 4 to be temporarily closed for several weeks. All students and families that use Everly Circuit can still access Gate 5, nearest to the Senior playground. Your co-operation with these necessary works is greatly appreciated.

This morning, our student leaders confidently facilitated an ANZAC Day commemoration at our whole school assembly. ANZAC Day is a National Day of Remembrance in Australia and New Zealand, primarily commemorating the first major military action fought by Australian and New Zealand forces during World War 1, the Gallipoli landing on April 25, 1915. It is now a broader day of remembering all Australians who have served in wars, conflicts, and peace operations. reminder that tomorrow, Friday 25th April is the ANZAC public holiday.

Please **DO NOT** park in or over driveways.






























So here's to learning, fun, and play, We grow a little more each day!




















Attendance – Unexplained Absences

All Victorian government schools are required to contact parents/carers as soon as practicable on the same day of an unexplained student absence. If your child is absent on a particular day and you have not contacted the school to explain why, the absence will be marked as unexplained, and a Compass text notification will be sent to you asking you to notify the school to explain why your child is absent.

To update your child's absence, you can use one of the following methods:

- **1. Online:** please log the absence directly via Compass.
- **2. Telephone:** please call the school on 5940-9532 and let the office know your child's name, class, date of absences and reason.
- **3. Email:** please email the school at <u>pakenham.lakeside.ps@education.vic.gov.au</u> and provide your child's name, class, date of absences and reason.

Notifying the school of your child's absence either prior to, or on the day that they will be away, helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of children and will fulfil your legal responsibility.

If your child's absence remains unexplained an email will be sent from school outlining the day/s your child has been absent from school and requesting a reason for the absence/s.



Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund Applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts for 2025 are \$154 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

It is important that funding made available in 2025 supports students to participate in school trips, camps and sporting activities this year rather than being held for future years. This funding can also be used in conjunction with any funding accrued from previous years.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Please complete an application form and return it to our school office along with a copy of your relevant card (your card can be copied at the office). Applications for the CSEF program for 2025 close on Friday 4th July 2025.

Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- . on the first day of Term one; or
- · on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder: or
- b) Be a temporary foster parent; and
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- * A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund</u> (CSEF): Eligibility I education, vic. gov.au

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students' attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink (see Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF): Policy | education.vic.gov.au).

Payment amounts

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child. Please refer to the policy for the current rates.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: <u>Camps</u>, <u>Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)</u>: <u>Payment amounts I education.vic.gov.au</u>

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

How to complete the application form

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- 1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
 - Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
 - If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.
