Principal's Report

One of the major events in our second term calendar is Education Week.

Celebration of Cultures Education Week 19-23 May 2025



The week provides the opportunity to collectively celebrate and acknowledge the achievements of our students. The theme for 2025 is "Celebration of Cultures", bringing together the rich diversity and cultural connections within Victorian government schools to the forefront.

Students will be participating in a variety of activities throughout the week, including some activities with multi-aged groupings across the school. An Education Week special edition newsletter will also be produced showcasing our students' achievements. This will be distributed on Friday afternoon.

We will be conducting our Lamont Book Fair throughout Education Week. Students and families have the opportunity to purchase quality literature to read and enjoy together. Families may also like to purchase a book to donate to our school library. Any donations will be acknowledged with a label placed inside the book. The **Book Fair** will be open each day next week from 8:30am-9:00am and 3:15pm-4:00pm in our school library.

At the beginning of Term 2, our 2025 enrolment process commenced. We have already had a significant number of inquiries regarding Prep enrolments and the process around enrolling at PLPS, with many families participating in school tours. All applications for enrolment are through an online process. Information and links are located on our school website. Information about the enrolment process is also available for collection from our general office. We will be conducting further school tours and information sessions for parents on May 14th, May 20th, May 27th and June 4th. The first of our year level camps sets off next week. Our year 5 students will depart for their four-day camp to Beechworth in northeast Victoria on Monday, May 12th and returning on Thursday. This camp provides our children with outstanding experiences that enrich and enhance their current learning in their history inquiry unit "My Place", in a town renowned for its role in key events in our nation's history, including the Victorian Gold Rush and renowned Bush Rangers. It also provides several opportunities for our students to demonstrate their personal development and how our school's values can be used when our children are in the wider community.

Last Thursday the weather turned on a spectacular day for our house athletics carnival at the Edwin Flack Athletics Track in Berwick. Students and staff had a busy and enjoyable day competing and adjudicating the multiple events available throughout the day.

Thanks again to Mr Vann and Mr Seton for their organisation and preparation that enabled the carnival to proceed very smoothly, together with other staff members. I would also like to extend my thanks to the many parents who attended the athletics day and provided support and encouragement to our students as they competed.

Yesterday we held our Mother's Day stall that allowed students to purchase gifts for mums or other significant female figures in their lives. At the beginning of the term, parents of our year 6 students received their individual Year 7 Secondary College Transition Packs containing information and an application form which needs to be completed and returned to school. These are due back at school tomorrow, Friday, May 9th. It is very important that parents ensure the application forms are returned by this date so we can forward the requests on to each relevant secondary college. Thanking you in advance for your assistance and support in this important process. Yesterday we had 46 students representing PLPS at the District Cross Country at Toomuc Recreation Reserve. The students in the 9/10 year age group ran 2km and students in the 11 and 12/13 year age group ran a 3km course. Even though this is always a tough event, our competitors put in their best effort and were proud of their results. We have three students who have qualified for the Cardinia Division Cross Country event being held on May 28th. We wish Evie in year 5, and Tyler and Lila in year 6 all the best for their next event. Thanks again to Mr Vann for the organisation of the event, together with supporting staff on the day.

Last Friday our Year 3 students had an enjoyable day at the Melbourne Museum. The visit was to support the students with their current Inquiry unit 'Victoria: Then and Now'. The students were able to spend time exploring and learning about the story of Melbourne through interactive and informative displays, as well as being immersed in the First Peoples exhibit. Students also took the opportunity of the fine weather to explore the many plant species that grow in both the Milarri Garden and Forest Gallery.

Last Friday students in all year level areas received their Term 2 Area newsletter. The newsletter has been produced to share information with parents regarding the teaching and learning that will take place at each year level. These were distributed to the students and have also been posted on Compass.

In the last week of term 1, after receiving conformation from external presenters, School Council approved the dates of our curriculum days for term 2.

A professional learning day for staff is scheduled for Wednesday, May 28th and our Student Led Conferences/ Parent-Teacher interviews will be held on Tuesday, July 1st. 














Monday 19th May - Friday 23rd May - Book Fair



Wednesday 21st May - National Simultaneous Storytime





Attendance – Unexplained Absences

All Victorian government schools are required to contact parents/carers as soon as practicable on the same day of an unexplained student absence. If your child is absent on a particular day and you have not contacted the school to explain why, the absence will be marked as unexplained, and a Compass text notification will be sent to you asking you to notify the school to explain why your child is absent.

To update your child's absence, you can use one of the following methods:

- **1. Online:** please log the absence directly via Compass.
- **2. Telephone:** please call the school on 5940-9532 and let the office know your child's name, class, date of absences and reason.
- **3. Email:** please email the school at <u>pakenham.lakeside.ps@education.vic.gov.au</u> and provide your child's name, class, date of absences and reason.

Notifying the school of your child's absence either prior to, or on the day that they will be away, helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of children and will fulfil your legal responsibility.

If your child's absence remains unexplained an email will be sent from school outlining the day/s your child has been absent from school and requesting a reason for the absence/s.

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund Applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts for 2025 are \$154 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

It is important that funding made available in 2025 supports students to participate in school trips, camps and sporting activities this year rather than being held for future years. This funding can also be used in conjunction with any funding accrued from previous years.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Please complete an application form and return it to our school office along with a copy of your relevant card (your card can be copied at the office). Applications for the CSEF program for 2025 close on Friday 4th July 2025.

Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- . on the first day of Term one; or
- · on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder: or
- b) Be a temporary foster parent; and
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- * A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund</u> (CSEF): Eligibility I education, vic. gov.au

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students' attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink (see Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF): Policy | education.vic.gov.au).

Payment amounts

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child. Please refer to the policy for the current rates.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: <u>Camps</u>, <u>Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)</u>: <u>Payment amounts I education.vic.gov.au</u>

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

How to complete the application form

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- 1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
 - Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
 - If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.
