#### **Principal's Report**

It was a treat to watch our students put on two very entertaining and colourful performances of "Follow Your Dreams" for appreciative audiences at the Cardinia Cultural Centre. The efforts of our children reflected the time and commitment put into concert preparations by our Performing Arts teachers, Ms Windust and Ms Dahmen. Thank you also to the children's home group teachers and education support staff for the support and assistance they have provided to our students. On behalf of our staff, I would also like to extend my thanks and appreciation to our parents and families for their support of the children and our Performing Arts program through the provision of costumes and purchase of tickets. Your efforts are much appreciated.

Yesterday Tyler and Evie competed in the South Metropolitan Regional Cross Country run in Hastings. They both ran well and finished in the middle of the field. Congratulations to both students, it is an awesome effort to get through to this level of competition.

Thank you to those parents who have accepted our offer and booked a time to participate in our mid-year student led or parent/ teacher conversations being conducted on Tuesday, July 1st, commencing at 11:00am and concluding at 7:00pm. Bookings remain open and can be completed via Compass for parents who have not yet secured a time.

The student led conferences and parent/teacher conversations provide an opportunity for students, teachers and parents to celebrate semester one achievements, together with an understanding and outline of the goals and future learning throughout semester two.

Please note that on Tuesday, when our parent/teacher

conversations are held, students do not attend school. If parents require assistance with childcare on the day, our OSHClub will be operating a full day program between their normal operating hours of 6.30am to 6.30pm.

As mentioned at the beginning of term 2, 2026 Prep enrolments are now open. There have been many inquiries and families attending school tours.

All Prep enrolments are managed through the Department of Education online platform 'VicStudents'. If you are intending to enrol your child to begin Prep at PLPS in 2026, please visit our website <u>PLPS website</u> and follow the links in the Enrolment tab. All applications need to be submitted by Friday July 25<sup>th</sup>. Notification of the outcome of your application will be communicated between Monday, July 28<sup>th</sup> and Friday, August 8<sup>th</sup>.

If you are experiencing any difficulties using the enrolment platform, please contact the school on 5940 9532 for assistance. If you are aware of any families who are considering our school for their child next year, it would be much appreciated if you could encourage them to contact our school and arrange their enrolment as soon as possible.

An important reminder to all year 6 students and families to please confirm their participation in our year 6 camp to Canberra. Although the camp is in October, final student numbers attending camp need to be communicated to the camp staff early next term. Thank you to those parents who have already consented and made payments towards the camp. To finalise bookings for the accommodation and the venues the students will be visiting, student numbers need to be finalised and are capped. With this timeline fast approaching, please ensure a response has been enacted via Compass for all students no later than **Friday**, **July 4**th. This is either providing consent, together with the corresponding payments to secure a place or declining the offer. Further payments can be made throughout term 3. Final payment for this camp is due no later than August 22<sup>nd</sup>. If you would like any assistance with this process, please call our school office.

As outlined last week, OSHClub will be providing a vacation care program for our students at PLPS. The full program is now available outlining all the fun activities planned for the 'World Explorers' themed program. Any inquiries can be directed to OSHClub on 0438 559 017.

#### Year 6 DANCE


Students have been exploring dance styles inspired by different cultures around the world. They have made their own dance sequences with dance steps inspired by these cultures.

## **Important Information - Parking and Road Safety**

**Dear Parents and Carers** 

We have recently been contacted by Cardinia Shire Council regarding a concerning increase in reports regarding illegal parking, dangerous driving and pedestrian safety around schools, across the shire.

Together with Cardinia Shire Council, we wish to remind drivers of the importance of safety and adhering to the road rules when parking around the school, at pick up and drop off times.

To ensure the safety of all pedestrians, students and members of our school community, we ask that you:

- Park only in designated areas: Parking is not permitted in or across driveways, on nature strips, no-stopping zones, no-parking zones, bus zones, or areas reserved for staff. Please adhere to all signage and the road rules.
- Follow drop-off and pick-up procedures: Use the designated drop-off and pick-up zones to ensure a smooth and safe flow of traffic.
- Be mindful of pedestrians: Follow directions from School Crossing Supervisors and take extra caution during peak times when children are arriving or leaving school.
- Be respectful: Council Parking Officers are required to conduct regular patrols around schools to ensure safety. Please be respectful, and courteous.

# Important Information - Staff Carpark

Our school carpark is for staff parking between 8.30am and 3.45pm on school days by order of the School Council.

During these times parents are not permitted to park in the school carpark.

The carpark is not permitted for use for dropping off and picking up students or for leaving your car unattended while collecting your children.

This is to ensure the safety of all students in the school.

### **LATE ARRIVALS**

Every child arriving after the 9am bell <u>must</u> come to the school office to collect a Late Pass to take to their teacher.

### **EARLY LEAVERS**

Should parents wish to collect their child/children from school early they must sign them out at the office. Please allow yourself extra time for collection as we only call students to the office once parents arrive.

Our lunchtime runs from 1:40-2.25pm and it can be extremely difficult for students to hear announcements over this time. If you need to collect your child/children over this period it maybe easier to collect students before lunch commences or after lunch finishes.

# **School Hours and Pick Up**

Our school hours are between 9am to 3.15pm each day. We understand that due to traffic and other unforeseen circumstances parents/carers may not be able to pick up their child/children on time. If you are running late to pick up and it is after 3.30pm your child/children who are waiting in the school yard will be asked to wait in our school admin building as there are no teachers on yard duty after this time. If parents/carers are regularly unable to pick up their child/children on time they will need to book into after school care.

OSHClub provide permanent and casual bookings.

# Providing spare clothes for your child

As we approach the cooler and wet months our grounds can become wet and muddy. It is a great idea to pack a spare set of clothing in your child's school bag so that they can change into should they require a change of clothes at recess and/or lunchtime. This saves getting a phone call during the day to bring some spare clothes up to school for your child.

Spare clothes are a great idea for children of all ages - even the big kids!



#### **Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund Applications**

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts for 2025 are \$154 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

It is important that funding made available in 2025 supports students to participate in school trips, camps and sporting activities this year rather than being held for future years. This funding can also be used in conjunction with any funding accrued from previous years.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Please complete an application form and return it to our school office along with a copy of your relevant card (your card can be copied at the office). Applications for the CSEF program for 2025 close on Friday 4<sup>th</sup> July 2025.

#### Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

#### Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible\* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- . on the first day of Term one; or
- · on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder: or
- b) Be a temporary foster parent; and
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- \* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund</u> (CSEF): Eligibility I education, vic. gov.au

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

#### Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students' attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

#### **Eligibility Date**

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink (see Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF): Policy | education.vic.gov.au).

#### Payment amounts

#### CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child. Please refer to the policy for the current rates.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: <u>Camps</u>, <u>Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)</u>: <u>Payment amounts I education.vic.gov.au</u>

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

#### How to complete the application form

#### NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- 1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
  - Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
  - If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.



#### Anglicare Victoria, Rental Stress Program

The Rental Stress Program supports families living in a private rental experiencing financial pressure. #### South East Community Links, Financial Counselling

They are qualified, non-judgmental professionals dedicated to helping individuals navigate financial difficulties. Whether you need guidance on managing debts, exploring your options, or negotiating with creditors, financial counsellors provide free information and advocacy you deserve. #### Berry Street, Saver Plus Program

Saver Plus is a FREE 10-month financial education and matched savings program. It helps you develop savings and money management skills, while saving for your child's or your own education. Participants receive matched savings from ANZ for every dollar they save once they have completed the program (up to \$500 for education items, such as school uniforms, computers and textbooks). The program also provides opportunities to attend online workshops to further develop your money management skills.



#### Peninsula Community Legal Centre, Tenancy Assistance & Advocacy Program

The team provide initial triage, assessment, and potential referral into the Peninsula Community Legal Centre for further advice or assistance. They can discuss Tenancy, for people in private rentals, rooming houses and caravan parks (support with VCAT etc). They offer assistance and advice for outstanding Fines, like driving on toll roads without an e-tag, parking and public transport fines (including WDP).



#### Services Australia, Indigenous & Multicultural Services Support

Indigenous Service Officers and Multicultural Service Officers will be available to help promote and improve access to Services Australia. They build relationships with local communities, connecting them to the services and payments they need in a culturally informed way. They can help you navigate the system and communicate with staff using language services..



#### The Salvation Army, Parent Pathways

Our voluntary program can help with some of the barriers to employment or education. These may include helping with driving lessons and gaining a driving licence. We can also assist with paying for courses, laptops to complete courses, engagement vouchers, paying for childcare bond fees or holding fees, referral to English classes, referral to family services and career guidance to name a few things.
